Future projects:

A monograph as a sequel to the Ley biography, which will assess the impact of Nazi social policy on Germany's labor force at the local and factory level, particularly as formulated and carried out by the Labor Front. Working title: "Modernization and Social Integration in Nazi Germany". Research substantially completed.

A biographical/ institutional study of the Nazi SS which focuses on its role as powerful competitor within the regime, as ideological interpreter and instigator, as self styled racial elite and metastasizing bureaucracy which both embodied National Socialism and ultimately helped to detonate the system.
