About the course

- The course is organized under the academic auspices of the Center for Applied Policy Research Munich (CAP). The CAP is the largest university-based policy research institute in Germany. The CAP focuses on European and international issues.
- European integration is a key factor in understanding the political, legal and economic systems of the 25 EU member states. The course analyzes the historical developments and the economic and political dimensions of the European integration. The course also explains the functioning of the institutional and political setting as well as the key European policies.
- The impact of EU membership and policies on both future and member states will be analyzed by means of examining different cases. Consequently, the course takes place in the German capital (Berlin), Bavaria (Munich) and the capital of the Czech Republic (Prague). Additionally, there will be excursions to cultural and historical sites within and around the three cities.
- Students from different academic backgrounds with a general interest in European integration and policies will benefit from each other in an intercultural and interdisciplinary learning environment.
